

Security regulations

Your safety is the most important thing during a regatta, but it is also important that all participants in the regatta sail in the same conditions.

Note the following points before each regatta:

- wearing an appropriate life jacket is mandatory
- three air bags are present and inflated
- the towing line floats, is securely attached to the base of the mast, is at least 8 m long and at least 5 mm thick
- one or two bailers are attached to the boat
- the centerboard is attached to the boat by a rope
- the rudder is secured by a safety device so that it cannot come loose in the event of capsizing
- the mast is secured by a mast security
- the distance between the sheet attachment and the boom must be 10 cm maximum
- a paddle is attached to the boat
- the distance between the sail and the mast must not exceed 10 mm
- the sail marking on the luff must be between the two marking rings on the mast. The sail marking must be visible on both sides of the sail
- only one sail can be used during a regatta

You must know and follow these rules. Failure to comply with these rules may result in disqualification (via protest)

- either by the race or organizing committee (which has personal responsibility for the safety of sailors)
- or by another sailor (non-compliance with racing rules)
